

On April 8, 1957, Mr. Daniel J. Hart, chairman board of selectmen in Chelmsford, turned over the first piece of ground to officially start construction of the new telephone dial office. Shown with Mr. Hart are Mr. Robert F. McAndrews and Mr.Ralph Cole, building inspector

The New England Telephone | and Telegraph Company has an-nounced that within the next two years they plan to expend a total of \$500,000 in installing two dial stations in the town of Chelmsford.

Because of the recent rapid increase in demands for telephone service in the greater Lowell area the telephone company is planning to establish a new dial control office in North Chelmsford in the fall of this year and another new dial central office in the Chelmsford Center area around the end of 1958 it was announ-ced today by Louis M. Reder, local area manager.

The building in North Chelmsford will not only provide additional telephone facilities for the people in that area but will relieve the load on the dialcentral office at Appleton Street in Lowell so that additional facilities will then be available for Lowell residents.

New telephone numbers will assigned to the North Chelmsford area and it will be necessary to change the telephone numbers of all customers to be served by the new North Chelmsford office. The new telephone number will be available and will be published in conjunction with the tele-phone directory to be delivered

August 1, 1957. With consideration to the requirements of the telephone companies universal numbering plan the new central office designation will be ALpine in place of

Glenview. As Mr. Reder pointed out this was only one step of the overall plan so that the tele-phone company will be able to grow with Lowell. He pointed out at the ground breaking ceremony that building additions were in process at the

Wilmington and Billerica central offices. A new building addition is planned for Westford this summer and a new building addition is in the planning stage for Tewksbury. # New Telephone Name and Numbers for NORTH CHELMSFORD

# OCTOBER 3rd

A new telephone name of ALPINE, and new telephone numbers, will become effective in North Chelmsford at 12:01 A.M., Thursday, October 3rd. Continued telephone growth in North Chelmsford has made these changes necessary.

#### NEW METHODS FOR DIALING CALLS

#### **Between North Chelmsford Telephones**

Beginning October 3rd, *two letters and five figures* must be dialed to call between North Chelmsford telephones. For example: To call ALPINE 1-6100 from another ALpine telephone, dial A-L-1-6-1-0-0.

### From North Chelmsford to GLenview Telephones

The letters G and L, followed by the five figures of the number, must be dialed to call GLenview telephones.

There will be no change in the method of dialing to ULYSSES numbers, or to other exchanges dialable from North Chelmsford.

Beginning October 3rd (but not before), refer to the white pages of your Telephone Directory for new North Chelmsford telephone numbers, and instructions for making calls.

New Telephone Build. In No. Chelmsford Opens Today

At 12:01 this morning strings were pulled in the new telephone building on Groton road in North Chelmsford which cut off the present Glenview telephone numbers and converted the new Alpine numbers.

Few persons outside of the telephone company will witness the brief operation that will bring to an end present numbers assigned out of the Lowell central office and place the new numbers working out of the No. Chelmsford office into operation. The method of disconnecting

The method of disconnecting the present equipment is known to telephone men as "pulling the heat coils." These are tiny devices that serve approximately the same purpose on each 'telephone circuit as a fuse serves on an electric power circuit, that is, to protect life circuit from too heavy a load of current. Cords will be attached to

Cords will be attached to these heat coils in the main frame room at Lowell and these in turn attached to a master cord or rope, each held by a telephone plant man. At a given signal the sound of a whistle—each man will yank his rope hard enough to pull all the heat coils simultaneously, thus disconnecting the old Glenview lines.

The operation of throwing the

new equipment into operation is somewhat similar and is known to telephone men as "pulling the shims." Shims are small pleces of fiber inserted in the new equipment in such a way that they act as insulators preventing the current from flowing through the equipment.

These also will be attached to cords and on the sound of a second whistle, a group of plant men will yank the cords and pull hundreds of shims, plus placing the "selectors" and "line finders" of the new equipment in actual operation.

After expenditures of over \$210,000 and over 12,000 man hours of work and months of preparation and planning, telephone subscribers in North Chelmsford will have a new dial central office and a new central office name, Alpine '1'.


