Chelmsford: Stedman or Steadman Street? Examine the Evidence. You Decide.

There has long been confusion about the spelling of Stedman (or Steadman) Street in Chelmsford, Massachusetts. Which spelling is correct? Where did the other spelling come from? (page 36) Why does the confusion persist?

This is what my research revealed. If you are in a hurry, you can get the most important points by reading the first and last pages. You will surely want to go back and read the whole story.



In the following pages, we will dig into the historical records to discover the reason why there is some confusion about the spelling. It will become clear that the "Steadman" spelling is the result of a careless mistake and some questionable record keeping in 1926. Almost everyone realized that spelling was bogus and continued using the original "Stedman" name.

The mailing label, address listings inside, and the map in the back all use the same spelling.









Page 38:

If there were any roads laid out by the town before 1659, they are not recorded. There were, however, roads in use previous to that time. One of the first of these passed between the cemetery and common, following the line of Worthen street and Crosby place to the house of William Fletcher, some thirty rods beyond the Crosby house. Soon, if not at first, this continued toward what is now the house of Jas. L. Stearns and from there by Golden Cove road and Stedman street towards the Merrimack river.

I won't bore you with all of the places Stedman Street is mentioned. They are listed in the Index.

Baldwin Street is just to the north of Stedman Street. This area is known as Middlesex Village because it was at the head of the Middlesex Canal. According to the Wilson Waters book, this 660 acre region was transferred from Chelmsford to Lowell in 1874.

There were 3 brothers in the construction and real estate business.

Along with wives and children, there were a lot of Stedmans around that time.

Patricia, great granddaughter of John G. Stedman, reported in 2003:

I just got off the phone with my Dad. ... He filled me in with some more info.:


His grandfather was not a Mill owner but a "contractor" you were right. He donated land to Lowell thinking the land was Useless. Hence **Stedman street***. ...*

That all fits together. The Wilson Waters book refers to this area as "Great Swamp." It is now the site of a garbage dump landfill.

When did Stedman St get its name?

Below is part of a map from around the time of interest. There is no date on the map but the file name contains 1875. It must have been before that because Middlesex Village was part of Chelmsford.

Notice the shape of Baldwin St which is a little different than today. At the time the southern part bent and lined up with the northern end of what we now call Stedman. It was a main road, not side streets off Westford. This will help us to interpret the list of residents.

"Baldwin street was then the main road to Boston, via Golden Cove and Chelmsford"

In the **1875-76** Directory, we find a couple mentions of Baldwin near Chelmsford line. This would be south of Westford St, i.e. present day Stedman.

The Directory has a starting point for Baldwin but there is no mention of how far it extends. There are people listed near the Chelmsford line so it looks like the same name was used past Westford as implied by Waters & Perham.

In the **1886** Directory, we find a description for Stedman Street and three residents.

STEDMAN, from Westford, opposite Baldwin, to Chelmsford line.

Geldert Charles S. wood turner, house Stedman street

Charles Goss is listed with address 203 in later years. This location is now occupied by the "Stedman Park" industrial buildings.

Goss Charles F., Merrimack, house Stedman street

George McDonald was previously described as being at "Baldwin, n. Westford, n. Chelmsford line." Now it says Stedman Street.

McDonald George E. carpenter, house Stedman street

From this we can conclude that **Stedman Street** name began somewhere in the range of 1876 to 1886. Even though we haven't found a Directory listing with John and George on Stedman Street, that's where they were before the name. If we could find another Directory, in that time range, we should find the Stedman brothers residing on Stedman Street before they moved to Wilder. A more recent *History of Chelmsford* has these, and other, references to Stedman St.

WESTLANDS FIRE STATION

In May, 1914, a special Town Meeting voted \$600 "for fire hose and equipment, the same to be located in that part of Chelmsford known as the Westlands." The expenditures from this appropriation included lumber, (\$82.66); construction labor (\$38.01); apparatus (\$468.40); and painting labor (\$10.35) for a total of \$599.42. The 1914 appraisal of the "Westlands Fire Apparatus" was as follows:

The building sheltering this equipment was on Stedman Street, about midway between the Chelmsford Street intersection and what was in 1970 the Stedman Street School at 12 Stedman St., and it was about the size of a one-car garage.



However, on the other end of the street, in Lowell, the expected spelling is seen.



This makes absolutely no sense at all. Why would different parts of the same street have spellings that differ by one letter?

Where did they get that spelling? From the street sign? That's the only other place with that spelling.

Summary, so far

Essentially everything is in agreement about the spelling.

- The street acceptance in 1900.
- The history books and other historical documents all agree.
- People named Stedman were in Chelmsford during the Colonial times.
- Three related Stedman families, in the construction and real estate business, lived on Stedman Street in the late 1800s and early 1900s. Genealogical records indicate that the street was named after John G. Stedman.
- Town Hall records (maps, lists of residents. Annual Reports) have used the same name all along.
- My mail from Town Hall uses the same street name: Water bill, Car Tax bill, Real Estate Tax bill.
- Legal documents such as: Property deeds, Driver's License, Car Registration.
- All of the modern maps, that I found, agree on the spelling. This includes the town's own GIS map used by many town government departments.
- Take a walk and observe all of the signs north of Route 3.

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

Why were some people so inclined to misspell it?

- Correct in 7 Annual Reports.
- Wrong in 5 Annual Reports.
- Both spellings in 2 Annual Reports.

1900 Annual Report:

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to accept the town-way known as Stedman street is widened and straightened by the Selectmen, extending southerly from the boundary line between Lowell and Chelmsford to the County road leading from Lowell to Chelmsford Centre. All land necessary for widening given.

The 1901 Annual Report spells it wrong a year after it was accepted by the town:

Voted, to accept the townway known as Steadman Street, as widened and straightened by the Selectmen, extending southerly from the boundary line between Chelmsford and Lowell to the county road leading from Lowell to Chelmsford.

The incorrect "Ste<u>a</u>dman" spelling began because some people had a tendency to spell it that way for no apparent reason.

There is no trace of anyone named Ste<u>a</u>dman, in Chelmsford, until 1992. (details later)

1904 - Stedman St. ceases to exist ???

The following report of the committee on naming streets was read and accepted:

School-house would refer to the Golden Cove School. The repurposed building is still present at 12 Stedman St.

Golden Cove Road:—From Town Farm, crossing Chelmsford Street at Golden Cove, by school-house and crossing Dalton Road, to Lowell line at Steadman Street.

This was Smith Avenue in earlier listings but now it has been renamed.

Redshire Road:-From Parkhurst Road at old turn pike, over Redshire Meadow to Golden Cove Road.

What was the committee thinking? Did they intentionally want to eliminate Stedman and make Golden Cove extend all the way to the town line or were they unaware that the street name changed when crossing over Chelmsford Street?

Whatever their intention, the town meeting gave the plan a rubber stamp approval, probably without looking at it carefully.

There is a subtle but important point to notice.

• The committee on naming streets incorrectly thought that the Lowell part of the street was spelled "Ste<u>a</u>dman." This will be turn out to be an important clue later when assembling the puzzle pieces.

In 1908, the Road Commission went cruising around town, measuring the lengths of roads, and got a total of 91.8 miles. This included:

The road leading off the Butman road called Smith avenue, and Stedman street by the old Turnpike to Russell road is 4 miles.

Huh? What happened? Or didn't happen?

Just because the street naming committee comes up with a plan and the town meeting gives a rubber stamp approval, it doesn't mean that the plan is actually carried out.

Stedman and Smith were still there.

What happened in 1926?

(B

In 1925, a committee was formed to compile a list of all the streets and make recommendations.

Three of the members were the same as the earlier committee that tried to eliminate Stedman (i.e. extend Golden Cove Rd. to the Lowell town line), rename Smith to Redshire, and incorrectly thought that the street in Lowell was spelled "Steadman."

Town Meeting Article 13 (pages 40 - 45) was to accept a list of names for streets and squares, which had been prepared by the committee. Do you think that everyone at the meeting closely examined the entire list, before voting, or just trusted the committee and gave it a routine rubber stamp approval without any scrutiny?

In that list, we find the original "Stedman" spelling twice and a different "Steadman" twice!!!

Smith Street—From Stedman Street to Parkhurst Road near old Turnpike. Spaulding Road—From Old Westford Road to Westford line on Francis Hill. Sprague Avenue—From Gorham Street to Brick Kiln Road. Steadman Street—From Chelmsford Stret across Dalton Road at Stearns Square to Lowell line. Subway Avenue—From Chelmsford Street to Steadman Street and Dalton Road. Stearns Square—Junction Dalton Road, Stedman Street and Subway Avenue. Vinal Square—Junction Groton, Dunstable and Tyngsborough

Roads, and Adams, Middlesex and Princeton Street.

A lot of people were involved. Didn't anyone notice the inconsistency?

What was their original intention?

There are two possibilities:

• They intended to keep the original "Stedman" but it was a typographical error.

The two instances of "<u>Stea</u>dman" are on lines adjacent to mention of "<u>Stea</u>rns Square." After seeing "Stea..." nearby, someone could have accidentally typed an extra "a" in there. As we saw many times before, some people were just inclined to misspell it.

• Changing the spelling was intentional but they were not very careful about finding all of the references.

They wanted to make the Chelmsford spelling consistent with "Steadman" in Lowell.

Alone, this is puzzling. After looking at other connected events before and after, I have to believe it was the latter possibility.

So, this is what we got

At first glance, this looks like a document from 1900 but it's an altered version. That would not be obvious unless you had seen the original. Even though it has been changed significantly, apparently in 1926, it has 3/10/1900 at the top and this statement near the end:

Filed in the Town Clerk's office March 13, 1900. Attest: George A. Parkhurst, Town Clerk March 26, 1900: In Town Meeting read and accepted. Recorded by George A. Parkhurst, Town Clerk

Dictionary.com defines "attest" as

"to bear witness to; certify; declare to be correct, true, or genuine; declare the truth of, in words or writing, especially affirm in an official capacity ..."

Former Town Clerk, George A. Parkhurst, died at age 70, on February 3, 1904, yet somehow he attested to this document more than 20 years later. How could that happen?

Who rewrote this document? We can't be sure but the Town Clerk, at the time, would be a good guess. Why didn't the editor "attest" to the accuracy, of the modified version, in 1926, rather than attributing it to someone dead for more than 20 years? Would this be considered falsifying a document?

Consider the curious note at the end:

NOTE: Both spellings, Stedman and Steadman, are used in the description. In 1926 the name was voted by the town as STEADMAN, the way the family of that name spelled it.

That is not what we saw for the Town Meeting in the Annual Report. The vote was to accept an inconsistent list of street names that had "Stedman" twice and "Steadman" twice. Who was this elusive "Steadman" family? That name is not among the 1900 land owners along the road:

- Mrs. Samuel Tyler
- Michael Roarke
- George W. McIntire
- George E. Spaulding
- John Alton
- Albert C. Williams
- Joseph Lemere
- Samuel Putney
- George Perry
- James F. Stearns
- Frederic A. Butters
- James F. Stearns
- J. M. Fletcher

There is no one by that name in:

- The Lowell Suburban / Chelmsford Directories from 1898-1899, 1900-1901, 1905, 1911, 1912, 1913-1914, 1915-1916, 1917-1918, 1921, 1925, and 1925-1926.
- The list of town residents, compiled by the Registrars of Voters, in 1931.
- Cemetery records from the Chelmsford Historical Commission.

These are very mysterious people. If they actually existed, they didn't leave a trace. We don't find any record of a Steadman until 1992.

Along with wives and children, there were a lot of **Stedman**s around that time.

Patricia, great granddaughter of John G. Stedman, reported in 2003:

I just got off the phone with my Dad. ... He filled me in with some more info.:

His grandfather was not a Mill owner but a "contractor" you were right. He donated land to Lowell thinking the land was Useless. Hence **Stedman street***. ...*

The history books refer to this area as "Great Swamp." A large part of it is now an inactive garbage dump landfill.

Some of the differences are quite significant.

Original 1900:

of said Spaulding, crossing Smith Avenue, so-called, and by land of John Alton, and other land of said George E. Spaulding, 'till it comes to a stone bound; thence by a curve to the right having a radius of 490 91/100 feet, 347 72/100 feet along said Spaulding's land to a stone bound; thence south 3° 33' east 880 61/100 feet along land of said Spaulding, land of Thos. Eurns, land of Albert C. Williams and

Altered version: 347.72 feet have disappeared.

Spaulding, crossing Smith Street, so called, and by land of John Alton, and other land of said George E. Spaulding till it comes to a stone bound; thence S 3° 33' E 880 61/100 feet along land of said Spaulding, land of Thomas Burns,

Original 1900:

The easterly line of the street is described as follows, viz: Beginning at a stone bound at the boundary line between Lowell and Chelmsford, which stone bound is on the easterly side and at the southerly terminus of Stedman street as laid out by the City of Lowell;

Altered version: While other original "Stedman" references remain intact, this one was changed.

The easterly line of said street is as follows, wir: Beginning at a stone bound at the boundary line between Lowell and Chelmsford, which stone bound is on the easterly side and at the southerly terminus of Steadman Street as laid out by the city of Lowell; thence S 6° 2' W 491 84/100 feet to a stone bound and continuing southerly parallel to the westerly line above described

This is referring to the southern end of the street in Lowell. Someone who cares about paying attention to details could argue that the eastern side of the road has no starting point because there is no "Steadman" Street in Lowell. The street naming committee always had a problem with the Lowell spelling so this seems intentional, not a typographical error.

There is a lot to be suspicious about here:

- Why was it dated 1900 rather than 1926?
- How could it be filed at the town clerk's office and read at a 1900 town meeting when it was written decades later?
- Why didn't anyone notice 347.22 feet missing during the careless copying and editing?
- Why was it signed by someone dead for more than 20 years rather than the person who rewrote it? Would this be considered falsifying a document?

A quick superficial glance could give someone the wrong impression. Digging a little deeper, it all crumbles apart.

The well-meaning, but misguided plan, to rename the street, is built on 3 reasons:


- The town voted to change the name. FALSE. Go back and review the Town Meeting report.
- The street should be named for a "Steadman" family. FALSE. No trace of anyone by that name. Three (3) Stedman families lived there.
- Lowell called their part "Steadman." FALSE. "Stedman" for almost 150 years. No evidence of any inconsistency.

If you yank the foundation out from under a building, everything depending on it comes crashing down.


Why would they do this?

Some of the pieces, alone, are puzzling. After fitting all the pieces together, there is a very clear and logical explanation for why this happened.

Since the time when the street was accepted, by the town, in 1900, everything was consistent:



Somehow the street naming committee got the idea that the street name in Lowell was Ste<u>a</u>dman so this was how they viewed it:



Having a mismatch doesn't make sense. It causes confusion and disrespects the families for whom the street was named.

What would you do? Probably make everything consistent. That is what they were trying to do in 1926.

They had good intentions but, acting on incorrect information, made the situation worse.

We would not have this mess today if a more vigilant person actually checked the information source for accuracy and pointed out the mistake before the botched street description got filed away.

I call this the "*Steadman Street Snafu*." It has a nice sound and perfectly describes what happened. They messed up. It is still causing confusion almost a hundred years later.

In the next few pages we will see that everyone, including the most likely author, ignored the bungled street description rewrite and continued using the original name. Or looking at the situation, on a deeper level, maybe they understood the original intent and followed that. Same result.

No Name Change Here


If the street name changed, it looks like **no one got the memo or they dismissed it because they realized that the "Ste<u>a</u>dman" spelling was just a mistake. The Annual Reports are much more in agreement, about the name, than during the previous 25 years.**

We can't prove who rewrote the street description, but it is a pretty good bet that it was done by the Town Clerk. The Town Clerk was Harold C Petterson from 1923 until he died in 1956. It seems a bit ironic that Harold C. Petterson continues to use the original name after he (probably) rewrote the street description to have a different name.

Town Clerks continued to use the original name.



Records related to the repair of the road retained the original spelling.

I have more but you get the idea.

Almost all references continue to use the original name. Just a few examples from the Annual Reports:

1932:

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to sell to the Westlands Improvement Association, Inc., for the sum of Two Hundred (\$200) Dollars or some other sum a certain parcel of land with the buildings thereon known as the Golden Cove School House. Said lot contains about one-half an acre of land and is situated on the westerly side of the Old Middlesex Road, now called Stedman Street. ARTICLE 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, or some other sum, for the purpose of aligning, grading and surfacing Stedman Street from Chelmsford Street to the boundary line on said street, between Chelmsford and Lowell; or act in relation thereto.

2. DRAINAGE

(a) School Street, West Chelmsford was drained for a distance of 1200 feet with 12" cement tile.

(b) Pine Hill Road was provided with drainage at several locations.

(c) Stedman Street at Chelmsford Street intersection was widened and a 48" steel culvert pipe placed to carry the brook water into the old culvert under Chelmsford Street.

1939:

We have a blanket project covering several roads in the Town the following have already been completed; The Dalton Rd. from Westford St. to Chelmsford St. was widened, straightened, greveled, rolled and oiled for a distance of 9137 ft. Approximately 3000 feet of drain pipe with several catch basins to afford proper drainage was installed. On Stedman St. 950 ft. of drainage was laid. Fairview St. in No Chelmsford was widened, graveled, rolled and oiled the entire length, and 300 ft. of concrete pipe and catch basins laid for drainage.

REPORT OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen.

Gentlemen:

The Highway Department has endeavored to treat and maintain our roads and hold the foundation in the best possible condition, requiring a constant maintenance program with treatments of Bituminous Materials. Surface drainage was placed in various locations and gravel roads maintained.

1956:

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds in the Treasury, a sum of money for the permanent construction of Stedman Street; or act in relation thereto. It is always unfortunate that some people suffer from the development of new highways. The ultimate completion of the new Route 110 and the long awaited construction of the balance of Route 3 should place the town at the crossroads of major transportation lines and it seems likely that this should eventually lead to industrial growth in Chelmsford.


During 1958, Stedman Street was reconstructed from the Lowell line to Dalton Road. This was built by our Highway Department with certain operations completed on open bid. The town's share of this Chapter 90 construction came from Chapter 718 funds granted by the State in 1956 for such construction projects. Thus, this was accomplished without adding to the tax dollar and, at the same time, the Road Machinery account was reimbursed through the use of our Highway equipment for this construction. We anticipate doing a similar reconstruction job on a portion of Concord Road in 1959.


2010:

The Board in FY2010 granted 15 Variances and 7 Special Permits. One denial of a Special Permit and Variance was voted in the case of the application for a home occupation on 12 Stedman Street. During FY 2010 the Board of Appeals saw a slightly larger number of applications for in-law apartments than had been the case in previous years.



The Water District kept using the original name: 1939, 1956


The official lists of residents continued to use the original spelling all along, from the earliest available list to modern times.



Most of Town Hall wisely ignored the 1926 *Steadman Street Snafu* and remained true to the original spelling.

Conclusion

"**Stedman**" Street was accepted by the town in 1900. (pages 24 - 27) Historical records reveal that the street was named for John G. Stedman who was in the construction and real estate business.



Decades later, the street naming committee somehow got the mistaken idea that the street name, in Lowell, was "Ste<u>a</u>dman" so this is how they perceived it:



Having a mismatch doesn't make sense. It causes confusion and disrespects the families for whom the street was named. What would you do? Probably try to make everything consistent.

In 1926, the street description was rewritten, apparently with the noble goal of making the street name match the street name in Lowell and the people who had lived there. The committee probably had good intentions but, **acting on incorrect information**, made the situation worse.

The bungled street description rewrite was almost universally ignored. (Or you might look at a deeper level and say its original intent - to make everything consistent - was honored. Same result.) Town Hall continued using the original name with only rare exceptions, which look like random accidental misspellings, rather than being intentional. (pages 52 - 61)

Everyone else (maps, property deeds, history book, Chelmsford Historical Commission, business signs, etc.) continued to use the original name with only two significant exceptions:

- The street signs.
- The USPS address database which trickles down into other mailing lists.

Without those two, the spelling mistake would have been forgotten long ago.

So, what do you think? After examining the historical evidence, which is the correct spelling? How can we get everyone to agree?
